The National Watermelon Queen program held 163 promotions across 123 days in 18 U.S. states, Canada, 6 chapter conventions, 7 Agriculture industry conventions, numerous festivals, fairs, schools, retail stores, military commissaries, and more. Additionally, media coverage on radio and television helped to promote the consumption of watermelon to consumers everywhere.



Government takes a different path

In 2017 the highlights included the Renegotiation of NAFTA, the impact of cheap imports on our members, the 2018 Farm Bill's policy statements for specialty crops, Healthcare reform & revisions, and the new Tax Reform law. If it affects your livelihoods, the NWA is on top of it, and involved, on your behalf.

Research seeks solutions

Production research is critical to the future of watermelon farming. As a result, the NWA continues to guide research through our grants program that will seek solutions to farm-related pest & disease pressures. We continue to call for projects that are relevant to your problems and focus on applied research solutions.



We must have Labor to do our jobs

Labor is everything to us - - Without it, we have no crop. It starts and ends with labor. And 2017 was an active year to debate the issues related to immigration, migrant labor and undocumented workers.

Once again, the U.S. House (in committee) voted to bring a E-Verify Bill to the floor for a vote. And once again, the NWA joined with other AG groups to block that from happening – unless it has an accompanied plan to provide AG with a viable and legal workforce.

We saw the introduction of three different immigration bills: AG Act – RAISE Act – STARS Act, as well as an established end-date to the DACA program. On top of them all, none of them have made it to the floor for a vote.

Executive orders (that will apply to the employers of foreign workers) were released, and are putting pressure on those employers (and labor contractors). Additionally, the H2-A Program experienced new issues and delays as a result of the EOs and a usage expansion that the government is not




prepared to handle.

The fact is We must have foreign workers to get the job done, and we need a government that will help us, rather than regulate, audit, raid, fine and even imprison employers of those workers. We're in this fight, together!
